Each project shall be subject to individual appraisal of environmental controls, particularly in respect of noise levels and dust generation, to ensure minimum disturbance and disruption is caused. Contractors shall be advised of the minimum requirements in the Construction Phase Health and Safety Plan and sites will be kept clean and tidy as far as is reasonably practicable.

The Company's employees will be educated and trained in environmental issues and the Company will ensure they have a good understanding of the environmental impacts of the Company's business and how to help reduce these effects.

Wherever possible, and where reasonably practicable, the Company will endeavour to utilise recycled materials.

Wherever possible, pollution and emissions will be reduced, and efficient use of natural resources will be made by minimising waste and conserving energy, water and other resources. Endeavours to use alternative, more environmentally sound materials will be made, providing that these are acceptable to the Company's Clients and of suitable quality as well as being economic to use.

This policy will be made available to employees and other interested parties including suppliers, subcontractors, customers, regulators, shareholders and the public, to encourage similar environmental standards. It will be reviewed regularly, and objectives and targets based on review findings will be set in order to make improvements wherever necessary.
